### **Notice for choice of Common Courses (GEC, SEC, VAC, AEC) for Semester-I 2023 (for BA (Hons), BCom (Hons), BSc (Hons), and BSc (Prog) only)**

All Semester I students of B.A. (Hons), B.Com. (Hons), B.Sc. (Hons), and B.Sc. (Prog), please note that they have to choose their Generic Elective Course (GEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), Value Addition Course (VAC), and Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) by filling a Google form, the link for which is given below:

**The last date for filling the Google forms is Saturday, 9<sup>th</sup> September 2023.**

**(A separate link for the BA (Prog.) and B.Com ( Prog) students will be notified separately.)**

#### **Please note the following points:**

- 1. The students should carefully fill out the form because this form can be submitted only once. Care should be taken in correctly mentioning the name, college roll number, examination roll number, e-mail id, and phone number (please provide your own active phone number).**
- 2. The choice of GE courses from a common pool is open to the students of B.A. (Hons.), B.Com. (Hons.), B.Sc. (Hons.) and B.Sc. (Prog.). They have to fill in three choices in order of preference for their GE course. The students should clearly indicate their first, second, and third preferences. Even though we will try to ensure that the students get their desired GE, there is no guarantee at all that they will get their first choice, so they are requested to pay attention while indicating their second and third preferences too.**
- 3. The Generic Elective subject cannot be the one offered by the student's parent department(s). Any honors course student cannot take a GE offered by their own honors department. For example, a student of B.A.(Hons.),Economics cannot take a Generic Elective Course offered by the Department of Economics. The B.Sc., (Prog.) students cannot take a GE course from any of their core disciplines. For example, a student of B.Sc. Physical Sciences with Chemistry cannot take a GE course offered by the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, or Mathematics; similarly, a student of B.Sc. Life**

Sciences cannot take GEs offered by the Departments of Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry.

4. All students have to choose an SEC and a VAC course from the common pool. The choice is entirely open and can be diverse and not connected to their core subjects. The students have to fill in three choices each for SEC and VAC clearly indicating their first, second, and third preferences. There is no guarantee at all that the first preferences of the students will be allotted; so please pay attention in filling the second and third preferences.
5. All students of B.Sc. (Hons) and B.Sc. (Prog.) have to opt for an AEC from a pool of Indian Languages. They have to take these courses offered at different levels depending on their prior competence in the language (i.e. whether they have studied the language till Class XII, Class X, Class VIII, or not studied at all). AECs of four languages are offered in this college – Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, and Bengali. Students may also pursue any other Indian language centrally taught by the language departments in the University or in any other college under the North Cluster Teaching scheme. In that case, they should fill the choice of the language they wish to study. The students should note that the Indian language once chosen as an AEC in Semester 1 will have to be the same in Semester 3.
6. Please note that students of B.A. (Hons), B.Com. (Hons), B.A. (Prog.) and B.Com. (Prog.) have to pursue Environmental Science: Theory and Practice 1 as an AEC this semester. The choice of Indian languages will be open to them in the next semester i.e. Semester 2.
7. If a student fails to submit the online form by the above last date, he/she may be allotted courses at the discretion of the college.

Departments have prepared video resources on the GEC, SEC, and VAC courses offered by the college. The syllabi and these video links are available on the college website. <https://kmc.du.ac.in/linkedpage/8/99/81> . The students are advised to go through the syllabi and the video resources so that they can make informed and careful choices. Unlike the last two semesters, only a very short window will be available for any course change.
