#### 'PRAYAS'

PRAYAS- the Enabling Unit of the College - aims to break the able-its barrier and empower the differently abled people in order to support the idea of overall development in an inclusive campus. The society strives to achieve this goal by organizing several programmes in order to foster full-development of PWDs in every sphere of life, whether academic, culture or sports.

To ensure this, PRAYAS recruited a number of enthusiastic volunteers for the academic session 2017-2018 after conducting the rigorous interview rounds. The society had organized the Orientation Programme on 18th of August, 2017 and organised its Freshers Talent Show' 17 on 1st September, 2017. Various events like Poetry Slam, Music Competition and a fun event called Human Train was organized. The members of Prayas displayed their artistic work in the FAPS Fresher's Talent Show on 18th September 2017 and presented their aesthetic drawings/paintings and photography.

In collaboration with Montage-The Film Society of our College, PRAYAS organized the screening of the 1980 National Award winning film \*SPARSH\* on 12th October, 2017. Our College itself, in collaboration with PRAYAS, had celebrated its first SAKSHAMTA DIWAS on 13th November 2017. The artistes of the Asmita: Theatre Group gave a seasoned and a powerful performance to highlight the theme that "disability is definitely not an obstacle for success". All the conveners of the society were felicitated during this event. As a part of this event, an Inter College Music (Vocal) Competition was organized for the PWD students. Various departments had organized the Sensitization Event in the month of February in order to help us understand the needs of person with disabilities.

PRAYAS organized the 'Inter College Sports Meet' on 22nd February 2018 and introduced a number of sports like 100m race, Shot Put, and Discus Throw for the PWD students. Inclusive cultural events like poetry, debate, quiz, one act play, singing competition and a fun event- Eklavya was conducted during the Annual Cultural Fest of PRAYAS- LEHAR '18 on 23rd-24th February, 2018, in order to provide a pivotal platform for the differently abled members of PRAYAS to showcase their talents. All these events were successfully conducted under the guidance of the Convener, Dr. Rajni Gupta.

# 5) Sports Meet- 2019


- ➤ The Annual Sports Meet of the Prayas Society was organised every year on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> March,2019.

# QR Codes for visually impaired students

College has come up with 82 QR coded acrylic sheets under the 'Mapped by Digital Vision' scheme to ensure seamless movement of 90 visually impaired students within the campus.

NEW DELHI: In a bid to make the campus disabled-friendly, Kirori Mal College has set up digital vision signage to facilitate easy movement of over 60 of its visually challenged students. Under a programme, titled Mapped by Digital Vision, the college has installed 82 acrylic sheets with QR codes on its premises. When a smartphone with a customised app comes

verbal messages go out identifying the location and giving other details.

The college plans to take the initiative a step further and have QR codes on books, medicine strips and ID cards "to give complete access to all students".

Keeping in view the problems faced by visually challenged students in reading signage doorplates and plagues, "the college has proactively endeavoured to equip the PwD (people with disability) students and staff members with adequate hardware and software support", said principal Vibha Singh Chauhan.

"The app provides navigation orientation and classroom-specific information, such as door-type, sitting arrangements and other crucial instructions in an audio format," said Ajeet Kumar, a member of Prayaas, the college's enabling unit that focuses on the needs of the people with disability

According to Kumar, 82 devices have been installed so far, from the college's main entrance up to the back gate exit covering the academic blocks, classrooms, laboratories, office, library and canteen.

"The digital vision app was formally inaugurated in the college on Sakshamta Divas on

Diyakar, a second-year BA programme student, said: "The app has made things simple: as it helps me locate places, from the moment I enter the college to going to the administration and academic blocks."

At present, 64 PwD students are presently on the rolls of various graduate and post graduate courses offered by the college and there are passionate 85 volunteers who make up an effective and efficient team at large under the guidance of our convener - Late Prof. Arunesh Chaudhary who was a gem of a person and we cherish his fond memories and owe a lot to him as well as our faculty members- Dr. Ajit Kumar, Dr. Soabha Kaur, Dr. Balbir Kaur, Dr. Arun Tripathi and Dr. Ram Babu.

Even during these unprecedented times of the global pandemic, the spirit of Prayas could not be shattered. A wide range of events were conducted during the session: 2020-21 on a virtual platform in lieu of the pandemic.

#### Orientation Programme:

The first day of the fest begun with a lecture by Professor K.P. Singh (Department of Library and Information Science, University of Delhi) on "Personality Development and Career Building" and was followed by –
