ADMISSION - GENERAL INFORMATION

COMMON UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST (CUET)

The Common University Entrance Test (CUET(UG)-2023) has been conducted for the admissions into all UG Programs in all Central Universities for academic session 2023-24 under the Ministry of Education, (MoE). The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) will provide a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from rural and other remote areas and help them to establish better connect with the Universities. A single examination will enable the candidates to cover a wide outreach and to be part of the admission processes to various Central Universities.

CUET(UG)-2023 is conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The candidate must note that the role of NTA is limited only for conducting CUET(UG)-2023, declaration of results, and handling of queries related to the entrance examination.

The University of Delhi hereby announces the eligibility requirement for admission to its Undergraduate Programs through the CUET (UG)-2023. For more detailed information the candidates can visit admission website (<u>https://admission.uod.ac.in/</u>) for academic year 2023-2024.

In order to seek admission to the Undergraduate courses of the University of Delhi for academic year 2023-24, the candidate must appear in CUET(UG)-2023. The candidates are advised to refer to the website of CUET(UG)-23 (https://cuet.samarth.ac.in).

COMMON SEAT ALLOCATION SYSTEM (CSAS)

Under-Graduate (UG) Programs are offered by the University of Delhi through its colleges in various streams of studies under different Faculties, namely Arts, Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, Education, Interdisciplinary & Applied Sciences, Music, Commerce & Business Studies, Mathematical Sciences, Sciences and Social Sciences. For the academic year 2023-24, admission to all UG Programmes of all the colleges of UoD will be done on the basis of online Common University Entrance Test (Undergraduate)-2023 (CUET(UG)-2023) only.

Simply appearing in CUET(UG)-2023 will not be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in University of Delhi. For admission to the UoD UG Programmes, a candidate must apply in Common Seat Allocation System <u>CSAS(UG)-2023.(https://admission.uod.ac.in/?UG-</u>Admissions/Common-Seat-Allocation-System-UG-2023)

The CSAS(UG)-2023 will serve as a single window for admission to all UG programmes of all colleges of the UoD. All the candidates desirous of taking admission to a college of UoD should apply only through CSAS(UG)-2023. Only the admissions taken and granted through the official online platform of the UoD (CSAS(UG)-2023) will be considered valid.

Candidates applying to the University of Delhi must refer to the Undergraduate Bulletin of Information-2023 (<u>UG BOI-2023</u>) for Common Minimum Eligibility criteria and Programme-Specific Eligibility criteria. RULES AND ORDINANCES

ORD. XV-B-MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS

- 1) All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice- Chancellor.
- The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify on this behalf.
- Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:

- a) physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/ Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
- b) carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
- c) any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
- d) violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
- e) any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
- f) any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
- g) wilful destruction of institutional property;
- h) creating or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
- causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
- j) ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
- 4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students:
 - a) be expelled; or
 - b) be for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or

- e) be debarred from taking University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
- f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
- 5) The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education and Librarian shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments, in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6) Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.

7) the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Rules that have been framed there under by the University.

ORD.XV-C. PROHIBITION OF AND PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

- 1) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any, way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
 - a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their selfesteem;
 - e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- 4) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of college, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also Suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.

- 7) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice- Chancellor accordingly.
- 8) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- 9) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- 10) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- 11) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- 12)For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13)All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

IMPORTANT POINTS FOR ADMISSIONS

- 1) Admissions to all Undergraduate Programs at the University of Delhi will be based on the scores obtained in CUET(UG)-2023, except for admissions to the School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) and Foreign Nationals.
- 2) An eligible candidate desirous of seeking admission to the Undergraduate Programs(s) of the University of Delhi for the academic session 2023-24 must read the contents of this Bulletin of Information, as well as the notifications, updates and information published on the admission website of the University of Delhi very carefully.
- 3) The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII Examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- 4) The candidate must have passed Class XII examination of any Board / University examination in India, or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- 5) For admission to University of Delhi, it is mandatory for the candidate to appear in CUET (UG) -2023 in those subjects in which s(he) is appearing/has passed Class XII.
- 6) In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET (UG)-2023, the candidate must appear in the Language/Domain Specific subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET(UG)-2023.
- 7) Admission will be based only on the combination of scores of language and/or Domain Specific subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET(UG)-2023 as per the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
- 8) Only the scores obtained in CUET(UG)-2023 will be considered for admissions to the academic year 2023-24.
- 9) Candidates must study the Program-Specific requirements carefully and then appear in Language and/or Domain Specific subjects of the CUET(UG)-2023.

- 10) The candidate is advised to check that s(he) satisfies all eligibility criteria for the program(s) for which s(he) is appearing in the entrance test. Admission is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned program of study. In case a candidate does not meet any eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program and appears in the entrance test, it is at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission, if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto.
- 11)Before registering for CUET(UG)-2023, the candidate is advised to carefully read the Bulletin of Information and Consult the University of Delhi Act, 1922 and the Statutes. The Ordinances, Rules, and Regulations of the University of Delhi, available on the University website, would be binding on him/her.
- 12) Candidates must be careful while filling the CUET(UG)-2023 form as certain fields such as Name, signature, and photograph of the candidate will be later auto-integrated by University of Delhi from CUET(UG)-2023. These fields will be non-editable.
- 13) As per Ordinance-I of University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the undergraduate programs in the University and its colleges except in the programs where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.
- 14)Gap year will not be a bar for the purpose of admission to undergraduate programs. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET (UG)-2023 for admissions in academic year-2023-24.
- 15) The name of the Candidate claiming reservation must match with the Candidate's name as it appears on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates and in CUET(UG)-2023. Similarly, the parents' names must also match in the certificates.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES

- a) Students belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes are eligible for the Post-Matric Scholarships of the Directorate of Education, Delhi Administration, Delhi.
- b) Under the National Loan Scholarship Scheme, students who have obtained a first division (60% marks or more) in their last public examination can apply for a loan through the College.

FINANCIAL AID

- a) Financial assistance in the form of a Fee Concession is available for deserving students. Online applications in the prescribed form should be submitted before the date notified for this purpose. No student will be considered for the grant of financial assistance unless they have submitted an application by the notified date.
- b) Some State Government Free ships are available for students belonging to special categories. Information regarding such awards will be put up on the College Notice Board. Applications for these Free ships have to be made through the College by the notified date.
- c) The 'Prime Minister's Scholarship Scheme (PMSS) is being implemented to encourage technical and post-graduate education for the widows and wards of the deceased/ex-service personnel of Armed Forces. The scheme is funded out of National Defence Fund administered by Prime Minister's Office. Scholarships are available for education at various technical institutions (medical, dental, veterinary, engineering, MBA, MCA and other equivalent technical institutions having AICTE/UGC approval).

INFRASTRUCTURE

Library

The N.S. Pradhan Memorial Library is one of the most extensive libraries in the University of Delhi. It caters to all the academic requirements of the college and also has an excellent collection of fiction and nonfiction texts, and a variety of books for general awareness. It is fully computerized, housing about 1.5 lac books and can accommodate about 350 students. The library subscribes to 52 journals in different subjects, 30 Periodicals / Magazines of general taste and 16 newspapers. Internet facility is available for students and teachers in the Portal Room. A Reference Section with a very good collection is situated on the First Floor for consultation.

A new computer room with the latest version of JAWS has been provided for visually impaired students on the ground floor. Oxford Dictionary for the VI has been purchased. There is a collection of 81 books in Braille, 22 tape recorders, 100 audiocassettes and 25 iPods for VI students. The college library also subscribes to magazines for the visually impaired.

Laboratories

The college has modern, well-equipped and efficiently managed laboratories for all the science courses offered - Physics, Chemistry, Zoology and Botany. Besides these, the departments of Geography, Computer Science and Statistics also have their own laboratories.

Seminar Room

The seminar room serves as a venue for interactive seminars and discussions, committee meetings and career counselling sessions. The audio-visual facilities available make it the ideal space for film screenings and workshops.

Banking and ATM Facility

The college has a bank and two ATMs in the premises. Punjab National Bank runs an extension counter at Kirori Mal College with an embedded ATM. Banking facilities are accessible to both staff and students.

Canteen

The Canteen at KMC has always had a great vibe for food and some fun. It provides a variety of foods and beverages at reasonable rates. It is spacious, clean and hygienic. The lawns outside add to the ambience.

Central Computer Lab

The fully air-conditioned computer facility enables students to stay abreast of evolving trends in today's world of information technology. Students are trained at this facility to hone their computer skills.

Portal Room

The fully air-conditioned lab encourages students to use the internet for academic purposes. It provides free access to many Universities' sponsored journals. It also provides printout facility for faculty and students.

Gymnasium

The college has a well-equipped, state-of-the-art, supervised gym facility for staff and students. It is equipped with treadmills, exercise benches and other weight training apparatuses.

Hostel

The hostel is an integral part of the college family. The Hostel is situated within the college campus with 89 rooms, it may accommodate more than 150 students. The hostel adds a dimension of vigour and commitment to the academic and extra-curricular environment of the

college. The entire hostel campus is Wi-Fi enabled and allows free access to internet facilities. Moreover, the hostel provides security to its residents 24x7 with the assistance of CCTV cameras installed in the common areas of the premises. The Hostel has various sections such as Kitchen, Dining Hall, Common Room, Reading Room, Hostel Office and Hostel Warden Office.

Staff Room

The college has a comfortable, air-conditioned and spacious staff room with modern facilities. It is equipped with computer cubicles and internet access, and also has a dedicated tea-room.

Medical Facilities

Students are advised to enrol themselves with the W.U.S. Health Centre at the University. The medical officer of the college is available for the advice and consultation in cases that require immediate and urgent attention.

Students' Common Rooms

The college has separate common rooms for male and female students. These are well equipped for between-study hours, with television sets and indoor games.

Mental Health Resources

The college has established a Wellness Centre, making available the services of a trained counsellor for both students and faculty. SPORTS COUNCIL

Kirori Mal College has a spectacular history in sports. It holds the record for having won five first positions in a single year (including three major games) in Delhi University Inter-College tournaments, and of once having been awarded the coveted Vice-Chancellor's Trophy for being the best All Round College. Year after year, we have provided outstanding players to the University, Delhi State and junior India teams in several sports. A sizeable number of students from the Northeast India are enrolled in the college in both the under-graduate and post-graduate programmes. The Northeast Students' Cell (NESC) is one of the most vibrant cells of Kirori Mal College. During the previous academic year (2022-2023) the NESC organized an educational seminar on the economic and academic challenges faced by the northeast students on 17th October 2022. Further a movie screening in collaboration with montage was also organized on 2nd February 2023. Three major events, i.e. Culina- The Northeast Food Fest, 8THNICA, and the NESSDU Sports Meet were also successfully organized by the NESC during the previous academic year. Over 30 colleges for Delhi University participated in the above events.

The Cell intends to be an active forum in the future, facilitating the exchange of ideas, culture, tradition, and diverse value system which in turn will help the students in realizing their true potential and shaping them into good citizens.

STUDENTS' UNION

The Students' Union is the premier student body of the college. It provides a platform to the students to enhance their leadership qualities and political abilities. Its primary objective is to raise students' issues and redress students' grievances. All the students of the college automatically become members of the Students' Union. An election is held to elect the President, General Secretary and other office bearers of the union. The Students' Union starts its activities with the 'Freshers Take-off' in the month of September. It also hosts its Annual Cultural Festival, "Renaissance".

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

Keeping in mind the need to create a more just society for India's historically marginalized sections, its religious minorities, women, persons with disabilities et al, the college has set up an Equal Opportunity Cell. The need for such a cell at this level comes from the understanding that higher education is a tool for attaining social and economic equality. The Cell aims to address the issue of access and equality while ensuring the standard of quality and relevance of education by implementing policies of the Government of India and promoting several schemes and programs for the disadvantaged groups that would help in eliminating social disparities.

The primary function of the Equal Opportunity Cell is to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programs for disadvantaged groups, to provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters and to enhance diversity within the college campus. The range of activities includes sensitization programs, English language proficiency programs, remedial classes and other academic related activities. Students (either individually or in a group) can freely approach the Cell to seek resolution of their problems and grievances.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

An alumni association was constituted in Kirori Mal College in October 2015. Through this the college aims to associate with all those students who have passed out of the institution and are now contributing in different realms of civil society. The association will not only inspire students to excel but also inspire the alumni to contribute to the development of the college.


