# Annual Report

## 2016-17

The inception of Academic Institutions is to bring a complete human being into existence, especially with the individualistic hidden talents within each student of any campus. We, the Kirori Mal College fraternity, are celebrating 63rd Annual Day this year. This is a day specifically significant to the students, a day of 'rewards' for all the strongest bricks that have contributed to the College in supporting to stand unflinchingly towards the unending heights through their incessant exertion in the last one year, and a day of encouragement for all those students who are ready to come in the escalating future to be a part of an institution with a glorious past and splendid present.

The encouragement for the exertions made by the students in different courses, fields, areas, genres is accelerated with the august presence of eminent persons of higher values and inspiring stature every year. The 63rd Annual Day is very special because of the catalytic presence of our Chief Guest Prof. Devendra Sinha, Dean of Colleges, Delhi University, our Guest of Honour Sri Amarendra Khatua, an Indian Diplomat, Prof. Amitabh Mattoo, Chairperson, all the Honourable members of the Governing Body and all the scholars, academicians and faculties of great repute and excellence.

We are fortunate that Prof. Sinha has taken out time for us from his busiest schedule. He has already graced our college on the occasion of Founder's Day and now he is here with us today on the occasion of Annual Day 2017 too.

Dr. Sinha is Professor of Oceanography and Marine Geology in the Department of Geology, Centre of Advanced Study at Delhi University. He was also Head of the Department and was Ex-Dean, Faculty of Science, Delhi University. Prof. Sinha obtained his Graduate, Post-Graduate and Ph. D. degrees in Geology from Banaras Hindu University with specialization in Micropaleontology and Paleoceanography and his Post-Doctoral Studies from GEOMAR Research Centre for Marine Geosciences, University of Kiel, Germany on North Atlantic Thermohaline Circulation and "Heinrich Layers" based on RV-Sone-Cores from Portuguese margin. He has also studied the recession of Alpine Glaciers, Switzerland due to climate change. After serving his alma mater for nearly two decades, he joined University of Delhi where

he continues to be a Professor, teaching Oceanography and Micropaleontology, Paleoclimate and Stratigraphy. His research interest includes—Refinement of Cenozoic Geological Time Scale; Paleoceanography of the last six million years; Understanding teleconnections in Earth–Ocean–Climate system on geological time scale; and Effect of plate tectonics-closing and opening of ocean gateways and their effect on ocean circulation and climate change.

We can go on and on recounting the achievements of Prof. Sinha pages after pages but we will not be able to reach the full stop.

I am elated to express my cordial wishes to Sri Amarendra Khatua who is, at present, an Indian diplomat; Currently the Director General, Indian Council for Cultural Relations and Dean of Foreign Service Institute. But above all and before, it is a matter of great privilege that he is a Kirorian, one among many of eclipsing luminaries of our College Alumni. Sri Amarendra Khatua did graduation and post-graduation from our College from 1973 to 1978. The Room Number 54 of the hostel was his abode in those times in the College.

Despite being an important decision maker and the Indian Ambassador to several countries, Sri Khatua is also an eminent poet of great sensibilities. He has written around three books which are soul touching and connect to the fabric of life. Apart from the literary life, he belongs to the 1981 batch of Indian Foreign Service.

During his diplomatic career, he has held Trade and Economic positions in various Indian Missions including Madrid, Mexico City, Karachi, Moscow and New York. At the Ministry of External Affairs in New Delhi, he has worked in different capacities in key divisions including Finance, Administration, Northern Division and Latin America Division. He has also served in the Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Planning Commission and Ministry of Industry.

He has taken charge as Director General, Indian Council for Cultural Relations. Prior to this appointment, he was Dean, Foreign Service Institute on 4th January, 2016. He is Ambassador of India to Argentina and concurrently to Uruguay and Paraguay from 2012 to December 2015 and Ambassador of India to Cote D'Ivoire (Ivory Coast) and concurrently as Ambassador to Guinea and Liberia and as High Commissioner to Sierra Leone from 2005-2007.

He has also served as special envoy to South Sudan and Sudan to broker peace between the two countries. There is an endless series of gems added to Sri Amarendra Khatua's credentials. The College is privileged to have him here on the 63rd Annual Day.

I also welcome, the Chairperson of the Governing Body, Prof. Amitabh Mattoo who, as the Chairperson of the College, took charge in September 2016 and thereafter has, indeed, transformed the very academic ambience as well as the administrative

functioning of the college, through his inspirational leadership. The college is aggrandized with such a visionary academician as the Chairperson of our Governing Body, along with other very eminent citizens, as members of the Governing Body, to give leadership and governance to the institution. I would like to reiterate the fact that it is not serendipity, for there is a phenomenon called 'catalyst' the presence of which changes the gestalt. Prof. Amitabh is one such person whose presence is enough to bring changes and contagious vibe which can be tangibly perceived and seen all around us.

Prof. Amitabh Mattoo is, at present, in the Disarmament studies at the Centre for International Politics, Organization and Disarmament (CIPOD), School of International Studies. His teaching and research interests include issues of international security, India's foreign policy, and arms control and disarmament. Prof. Mattoo has been visiting Professor at the Centre for International Security and Cooperation at Stanford University, at the Joan B. Kroc Institute for Peace Studies, the University of Notre Dame, and at the Program on Arms Control, Disarmament and International Security at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and at the Maison des Sciences de' Lomme at Paris. He has been Vice-Chancellor of Jammu Kashmir University in 2008. He writes regularly for Indian newspapers, including The Telegraph and The Hindu and is a commentator on television. His presence is destined to elevate the college to newer heights in the coming time.

Special thanks to one of our Governing Body members, Prof. M. Wali, who is an Indian cardiologist and a former honorary physician to Sri R. Venkataraman and Sri Shankar Dayal Sahrma and currently a serving physician to Honourable President of India, Sri Pranav Mukherjee. I am personally indebted to have him with us. I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to Lt. I. J. Singh, retired lieutenant general of Indian army. I acknowledge the presence of Justice A. K. Patnaik, an Indian jurist and former judge of the Supreme Court of India. I deeply feel obliged to such a presence of dignitaries in the Governing Body of the College who will take the institution to unimaginable heights and altitudes.

I feel honour-bound to the availability of and facilitation made by Dr. Kirti Ranjan who is also the Convenor of the Building Committee of the College. Dr. Ranjan's contribution towards college has been immense and I thank him for being so magnanimous to us.

The 63rd Annual Day of College is indeed special, in the light of the unprecedented achievements of the institution, in the last academic year. In the process of accreditation and assessment, undertaken by the NAAC Peer Team, from 24th- 26th October, 2016, our college secured the highest A+ Grade, with a commutative CGPA score of 3.54, one of the highest in the entire University, especially among colleges, which are multidisciplinary in nature.

This achievement was made possible, by the indefatigably relentless efforts of the teachers, the students and the non-teaching staff, who worked day in and day out, to showcase the best of the best of the college, and to attain to the highest cradle.

The other alumni meet for fund raiser was also organized by the Alumni Association of the college on 25th March this year where the college alumni had shown great zeal and vigour for bringing back the glory of the Auditorium which has given many role models to the world.

So, after successful achievements in nineteen months, we all are together to accomplish many more big assignments for the college. The support rendered by my faculty members, young and the veteran ones towards me has been immense. Each unit of the college deserves to be a great sense of thankfulness which is nothing but for their own institution.
