## Notice for choice of Common Courses for Semester-II, 2024

All Semester II students, please note that they have to choose their Generic Elective Course (GEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), Value Addition Course (VAC), and Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) by filling out a Google form, the link for which is given below. The last date for filling out the Google forms is **Saturday**, **13th January 2024**.

## **Instructions:**

- 1. The students should carefully fill out the form because **this form can be submitted only once**. Care should be taken in correctly mentioning the name, college roll number, examination roll number, e-mail ID, and phone number (please provide your active phone number).
- 2. The Generic Elective course cannot be the one offered by the student's department(s), that is it cannot be one belonging to the student's honors or core discipline(s). For example, a History (H.) student cannot take the Generic Elective Course offered by the Department of History. Similarly, a B.Com (H.) student cannot take the Commerce GEC. Further, BSc (P.) students cannot take any GEC belonging to any of the core disciplines in their respective programmes. For example, a student of a B.Sc.(P) with Chemistry cannot take Physics, Chemistry or Mathematics as their GEC.
- 3. All students opting for a GEC will have to provide three choices of GE courses in order of preference. Though we will attempt to provide the student's first choice, we may not always be able to do so, given the number of applicants in a course. In such cases 'first come first serve' may be adopted as one of the basis for allocation.
- 4. BCom(P) students will mandatorily pursue English GEC in this semester and all BA (P.) students (except cases mentioned in the next point) will mandatorily

pursue Hindi GEC this semester. The level at which they will pursue Hindi GEC will depend on the level to which they have studied Hindi in school.

- 5. However, all such students of the BA (P.) who (i) Hindi as one of the core disciplines (ii) have not studied Hindi up to Class VIII or beyond or have not studied it at all in school (including all foreign students) are to choose their GEC from the common pool. However, while selecting their GEC from the common pool they cannot choose the GECs offered by the departments of their core disciplines. So, BA (P.) students with Hindi and Political Science/History as their core disciplines cannot choose Hindi and Political Science/History as their GEC from the common pool. All such students opting for a GEC from the common pool have to provide three choices of GE courses in order of preference. Though we will attempt to provide the student's first choice, we may not always be able to do so, given the number of applicants in a course.
- 6. All students have to choose an SEC and a VAC course from the common pool. The students have to fill in three choices each for SEC and VAC indicating their first, second, and third preferences. There is no guarantee at all that the first preferences of the students will be allotted; so please pay attention in filling the second and third preferences. The students **cannot choose** in Semester II the same SEC or VAC, that they have taken in Semesters I.
- 7. Some courses are sequel courses like Vedic Mathematics and NCC. Only those students who have taken the level I course can take the level II course. Similarly, only those who have taken both levels I and II, can take level III. The NCC course can be taken only by the students who are enrolled in NCC in the college.
- 8. All students of B.Sc.(H) and B.Sc.(P) will now mandatorily pursue Environmental Science (Course I). All students of BA(H), BA(P), BCom(H) and BCom(P), will pursue an Indian language AEC. Please note that the same language will be studied by these students in Sem IV. Hindi A, B, C; Sanskrit A, B, C; Urdu A, B, C and Bengali A are available in our college
- 9. If a student fails to submit the online form by the above last date, he/she may be allotted courses at the discretion of the college. Departments have prepared video resources on the GEC, SEC, and VAC courses offered by the college. The syllabi and these video links are available on the college website. The students are advised to go through the syllabi and the video resources so that they can make

informed and careful choices. Only a very short window will be available for any course change.
