Notice for choice of Common Courses (GEC, SEC, VAC, AEC) for Semester-I 2023 (for BA (Prog.) and B.Com (Prog) only)

All Semester I students of for BA (Prog.) and B.Com (Prog) only please note that they have to choose their Generic Elective Course (GEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), Value Addition Course (VAC) and Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) by filling a Google form, the link for which is given below:

The last date for filling the Google forms is 11:59 PM, Saturday 19th August 2023.

Please note the following points:

- 1. The students should carefully fill out the form because this form can be submitted only once. Care should be taken in correctly mentioning the name, college roll number, examination roll number, e-mail id, and phone number (please provide your own active phone number).
- 2. BA Programme students will mandatorily pursue English GEC this semester (except for those who have English Discipline as a core subject).
- 3. All BA Programme students who have English Discipline as one of their core subjects will choose their GEC from the common pool of GE courses.
- 4. All B.Com Programme students will mandatorily pursue Hindi GEC this semester. The level at which they will pursue Hindi GEC will depend on the level to which they have studied Hindi in school.
- 5. However all such students of B.Com. Programme who have not studied Hindi up to Class VIII or beyond or have not studied it at all in school (including all foreign students) are to choose their GEC from the common pool. However, while selecting their GEC from the common pool they cannot choose the GECs offered by the departments of their core disciplines. So, B.Com. Programme students cannot choose Commerce GEC from the common pool and BA Programme students with English and Political Science as their core disciplines cannot choose English and Political Science as their GEC from the common pool. All such students opting for a GEC from the common pool have to provide three choices of GE courses in order of preference. Though our attempt will be to provide the student's first choice, we may not always be able to do so, given the number of applicants in a course.

- 6. All students have to choose an SEC and a VAC course from the common pool. The choice is entirely open and can be diverse and not connected to their core subjects. The students have to fill in three choices each for SEC and VAC clearly indicating their first, second, and third preferences. There is no guarantee at all that the first preferences of the students will be allotted; so please pay attention in filling the second and third preferences.
- 7. All students of B.A. (Prog), and B.Com. (Prog) have to pursue Environmental Science: Theory and Practice 1 as an AEC this semester. The choice of Indian languages will be open to them in the next semester i.e. Semester 2.
- 8. Students have the option to study an SEC, VAC, or AEC, not available in the college, in one of the other colleges of the North Campus Cluster of Colleges. However, students are advised to choose from the range of courses available within the college, given the logistics involved.
- 9. If a student fails to submit the online form by the above last date, he/she may be allotted courses at the discretion of the college.

Departments have prepared video resources on the GEC, SEC, and VAC courses offered by the college. The syllabi and these video links are available on the college website. https://kmc.du.ac.in/linkedpage/8/99/81. The students are advised to go through the syllabi and the video resources so that they can make informed and careful choices. Unlike the last two semesters, only a very short window will be available for any course change.
